

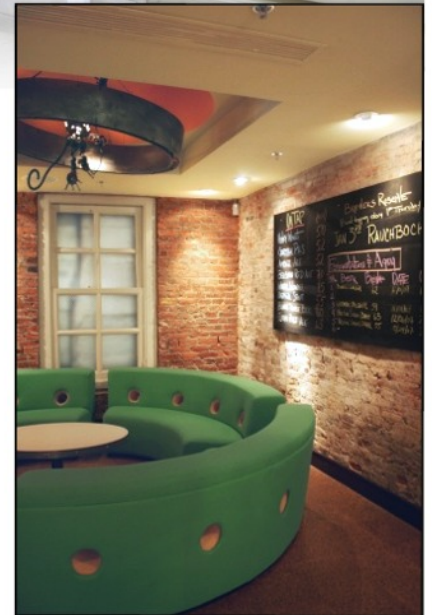
Penn Valley Constructors, Inc.

The basement level houses the tanks which deliver beer to the taps at the bar on the first floor above.

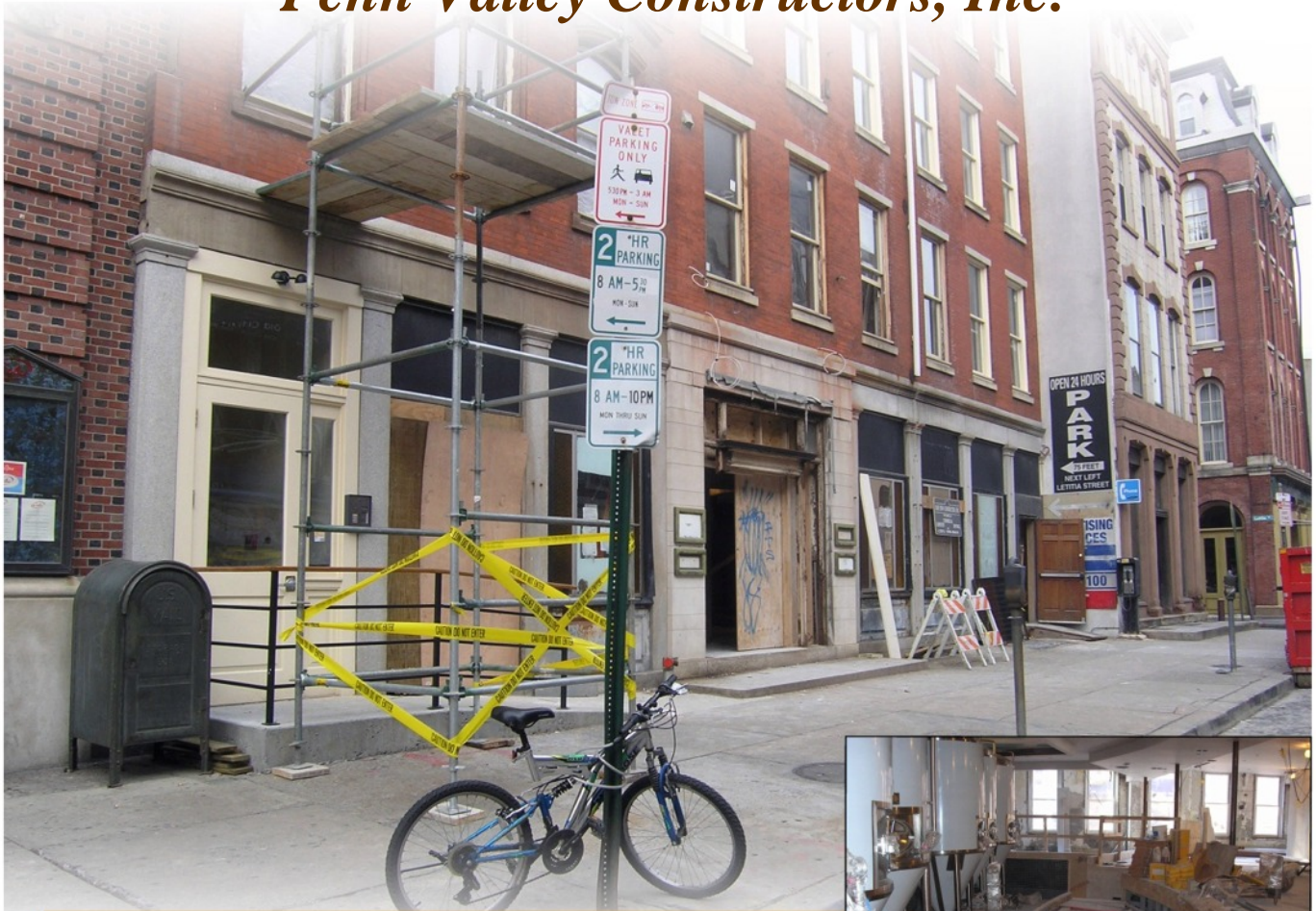

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A major challenge during the construction phase, as illustrated below, was the delivery and installation of the 1,200 lb brewery tanks. This process involved temporarily closing the city block so the tanks could be marshaled onto the street and into the building by crane.



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
